Part IV – Narrative Description of Your Activities

Jivan Rashmi is a nonprofit corporation organized and operated exclusively for a charitable purpose. Specifically, this organization has been formed to provide relief to the poor, distressed and underprivileged. Our organization has designed and developed one (1) program in furtherance of our purpose.

Our program is entitled: **Jivan Rashmi**. The purpose of this program is to provide relief to the poor, distressed and underprivileged. We further our purpose under this program by providing a channel to connect sponsors with patients who cannot afford critical medical procedures.

Our mission is to fund medical procedures for economically disadvantaged people who are not able to pay for their own operations. We are creating a website which will list procedures that people need but are not able to fund. We will advertise and get them funded by soliciting donations from many people. This is micro-charity for saving lives; for example, Kiva.org, but for medical procedures.

We work with local NGOs in recipient countries, India to start with, who will post people's profile and procedure on our website which needs to get funded. We will collect the required money by advertising and letting many people sponsor the medical procedure. Once the money is collected, we will send the funds to the local NGO so that the person in need of the medical procedure gets the medical care needed without seeing the money.

A team of founders and other volunteers, with the motivation to help others, will conduct our program. Our program will be conducted continuously through the internet at www.jivanrashmi.org. Each event will last from the time the patient realizes they need the procedure to the time they get their funding completed. Our program is open to the public and there are no fees associated with it. It will begin as soon as we can create a functional website and get the 501(c)(3) certification.

The officers and directors administer this program through a donation of their services. This program will consume 100% of the organization's time. This program will be advertised through word of mouth, our website www.jivanrashmi.org, and email and personal contacts. It is funded through donations to cover the nominal expenses

associated with it. Planning for our program is conducted at our headquarters as listed on this Form 1023. Through the successful execution of our program, we further our purpose of providing relief to the poor, distressed and underprivileged.
